For more than four decades, **Peter Yarrow** committed his time and talent to the Civil Rights Movement, to Equal Rights, to the cause of peace, to the environment, gender equality, homelessness, hospice care, and education.

On behalf of Operation Respect (501C-3) **Yarrow** has appeared, pro bono, in areas as diverse as Hong Kong Vietnam, Bermuda, Croatia, South Africa, Egypt, Argentina and Canada. In all, the program has been presented to many educational leaders and more than 10 million children. In some form, the project has reached nearly 1/3 of all elementary and middle schools in America; at least 20,000 schools, in all.
